Fundraising Support

We all know that NSW is experiencing one of the worst droughts in many years at the present. Our farmers have been doing it tough and scientific analysis of Australia's drought extremes has shown the current crisis is likely to be the worst in 400 years according to an article I was reading recently on news.com.au. I have thrown in my hand to help in the best way I know how by performing at a couple of drought relief

fundraisers over the last few months to help raise funds to support our local farmers.



I must say the support and donations have astounded me. People have been so generous in their donations. I am so proud to be an Aussie. When it comes to helping out our mates, you can always rely on an Aussie to help.

The Railway Hotel Cowra held a drought relief fundraising night on Friday 10th August. It was a fun and well-supported night with the hotel and patrons raising over \$3000 on the night. It was my first time performing at

Ned's Legendary Heroes

Ned's Legendary Heroes features achievements, facts and other information on a famous artist who is legendary in Ned's eyes.

Glen Travis Campbell was born August 22nd 1936 in Billstown, Arkansas. He was diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease in late 2010 and after embarking on a worldwide farewell tour, where he became too ill to travel to Australia, he eventually died in August 2017 in Nashville, Tennessee aged 81.

He was best known for a series of hit songs in the 1960s and 1970s, and for hosting a music and comedy variety show called The Glen Campbell Goodtime Hour on CBS television,

from January 1969 through June 1972. He released over 70 albums in a career that spanned five decades, accumulating over an astonishing 45 million record sales worldwide, including 12 gold albums, four platinum albums, and one double-platinum album.



My all-time favourite song by Glen is Wichita Lineman for which he won a Grammy Hall of Fame award in 2000. Although the song was not written by Glen (written by Jimmy Webb for Glen Campbell in 1968), I believe Glen bought the emotion out in the song and gave it an almost eerie tone that evokes a sort of "lonely" feeling that line workers would have experienced being away from their family and friends out in the field attending to the neverending network of phone lines in the US for weeks at a time.

When I was a kid growing up out in the bush around the Cobar area we lived on some remote property/stations where dad would work as a farm hand. I remember when we first moved to a property called "Mt Drysdale" on the Bourke road. The "workers" house was being house-sitted by an old guy, I think his name was Jim. He had been living in the house all alone for some time. I remember thinking "how could anyone live on their own out in the middle of nowhere for so long". When I hear the song, Wichita Lineman, I think about people like Jim and how alone he must of felt at times. I also think about how we all can feel a little alone or homesick sometimes. I think it is brilliant and almost genius that this song is so powerful that it can bring that emotion forward just by listening to it. I love music!!
